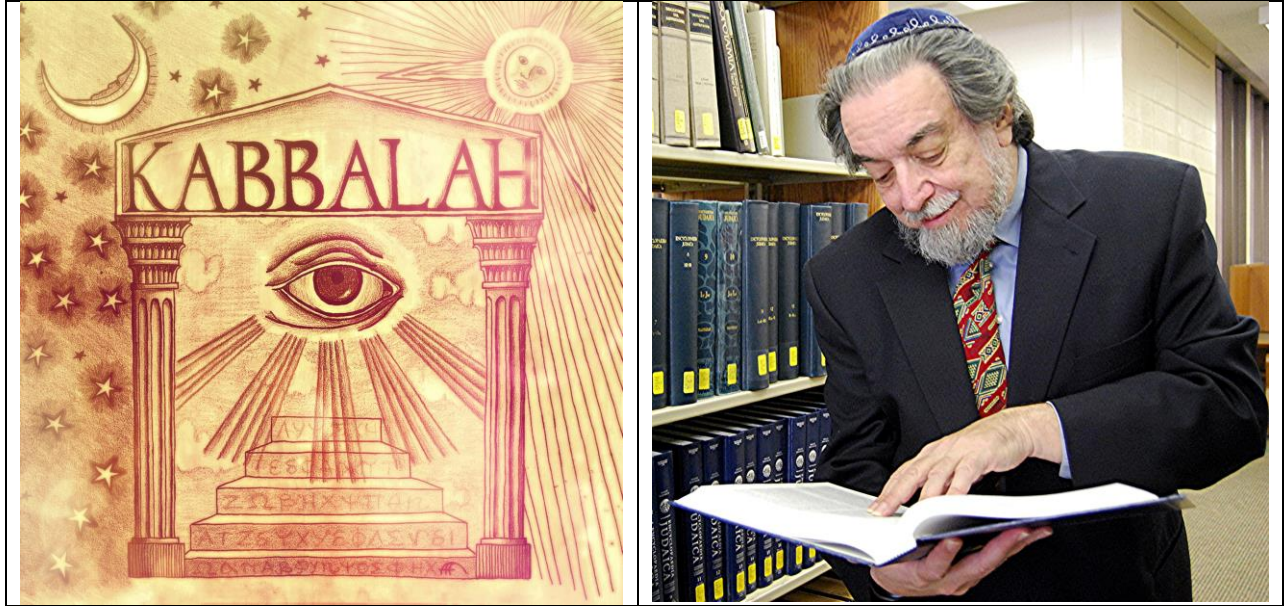


KABBALAH: 3 CLASSES ON SUNDAYS, 2-4 pm
February 4, 11, 18
Taught by Rabbi Zev-Hayyim Feyer



These classes will focus on *The Zohar* is the central document of the Jewish mystical tradition. It is traditionally ascribed to Rabbi Simeon bar Yohai, a sage of the second century CE, but it was not revealed in writing until the Spanish Rabbi Moshe de Leon transcribed it in the thirteenth century. In this series, we will review the significance of the Zohar, both traditionally and for modern Judaism, and we will examine selected passages from the Zohar, especially those Zoharic passages that have found their way into the Siddur (prayer book).

Rabbi Zev-Hayyim Feyer holds a Master of Arts in Religion from Claremont School of Theology, where he has completed his course work toward a PhD in Hebrew Bible. He is a member of the National Advisory Board of the Jewish Peace Fellowship, and he serves on the Boards of the Pomona and Inland Valley Martin Luther King, Jr., Program and the Inland Empire interfaith Working Group for Mid-East Peace. He was and remains a founding member of OHALAH, the Association of Rabbis for Jewish Renewal, and he is a member of both the Claremont and Upland Interfaith Councils. Rabbi Feyer has taught classes and led workshops (he prefers to say “playshops”) and seminars not only at synagogues, but at churches, mosques, and other spiritual centers as well. His subjects have included Kabbalah, Self-Esteem, Forgiveness, the Metaphysical Interpretation of Scripture, Spiritual Tales of Many Traditions, the Divine Commandment of Non-Violence, and many related areas.
