Dear Parent(s):

Please join us this coming year so your children can strengthen their Jewish identity, explore their connection with the divine, celebrate Jewish life and Torah, and be a force for healing and justice in the world. The Temple Beth El Religious School is an interactive program that creates a nurturing school environment for Pre- K through 10th grade students.

First, what's new: In an effort to better accommodate crowded schedules and provide more individualized attention, our Dalet Hebrew class is moving to an all-tutor system; \$400 per student covers 20 sessions with a tutor that can be scheduled at the convenience of student and tutor. Additionally, we will be combining our Aleph and Bet Hebrew classes into one Aleph/Bet class, beginning in 4th grade. For this next year, Gimmel will remain as a class, for 5th graders. Finally, please note the change this year regarding class times. Classes will begin on **September 8**. Jewish Studies start at 9:00AM followed by a snack at 11:00AM; Hebrew classes are from 11:30AM until 1:00PM.

In weekly Sunday classes, students learn a variety of topics including: Torah, Holidays, History, Prayers (Tefilah), Israel, Acts of Loving-Kindness (G'milut Hasadim), Hebrew, and more, including school-wide holiday celebrations, music, Judaic art, and Israeli dancing.

To better acquaint all parents with the Religious School schedule and requirements, as well as to get your feedback, there will be a mandatory meeting for parents on the first day of school, September 8 at 9:30 AM following an all-school assembly. Please make every effort to attend as this is a very important meeting.

Our Family Services are scheduled for the first Friday of each month at 6:30 PM, and will involve all students from the Religious School. We also offer Saturday services once a month. We encourage families to attend. By attending services, your children will enhance their Jewish education and prepare for becoming a Bar or Bat Mitzvah. Please remember that we do require attendance at **10 services** during the year prior to a Bar or Bat Mitzvah.


We would like to remind you that we require 75% attendance at Religious School classes in order for your child to become a Bar or Bat Mitzvah.

Snack at 11:00 A.M. is a time for the students and their parents to chat and catch up, deepening a connection to our Temple community. Parent Missy Sbar has graciously offered to coordinate again. We ask that parents sign up to sponsor the snack one or more times during the year. There will be a sign-up sheet in the Social Hall, and a form is enclosed. We are also enclosing some guidelines which include our TBE Kashrut Policy and the suggested budget.

Safety of our children is our first priority, therefore, please follow our check-in and check-out procedures and under no circumstances should your child(children) be outside without adult supervision. We certainly appreciate your cooperation with this.

On behalf of the entire TBE staff and the Religious Education Committee, we look forward to a flourishing year. Have a wonderful summer.

Basic philosophy of Temple Beth El's Religious School Program

1. The Religious School experience is designed to develop well-rounded and knowledgeable Jews who can participate meaningfully in the Jewish community.
2. The primary goal of this program is building Jewish identity, which includes Jewish traditions, values, and practices; basic Hebrew skills; and a connection to Israel.
3. Hebrew is critical for a strong and sustainable Jewish identity.
4. Jewish education and identity are a lifelong process, and continue beyond Bar/Bat Mitzvah. Therefore we provide programs through 12th grade, including Confirmation and the opportunity for post-Confirmation students to serve as *madrichim* (aides) in the Religious School classroom.
5. A significant goal of our programs is to build community among students, and for students to acquire a positive image of both Judaism and the synagogue.
6. All programs include both formal (curriculum-based) and informal (activity-based) learning environments.
7. The synagogue's role in building Jewish identity is complementary to the parents' role. Programs are designed to empower family discussion, practice, and participation.

What Parents Can Expect from Temple Beth El's Religious School

1. A commitment to provide students with an engaging Jewish education that includes both Judaica and Hebrew.
2. A physically, emotionally, and spiritually safe environment for the children.
3. Embracing of children who have a non-Jewish parent or extended family members.
4. Class sizes of no more than 15 students.
5. Faculty that is also committed to their own Jewish identity development.
6. Frequent communication with parents, as well as responsiveness to parent feedback.
7. A sincere attempt to meet any reasonable request or special need.
8. Written feedback at least twice per year specific to each student.
9. Resources for parents to help their children.
10. Opportunities for parents to develop their own Jewish identity and knowledge.
11. Respect for other religious traditions of our world.

12. What Temple Beth El's Religious School Expects from Parents

1. Commitment to regular participation in Religious School. **Students must attend classes at least 75% of the time** in order to have a Bar/Bat Mitzvah and Confirmation.
2. Reinforcement of Jewish learning and practice at home – ultimately, religious identity comes from parents. Parents are also asked to ensure that their children review Hebrew at least 10 minutes per day.
3. Agreement to raise your child Jewish. While many of our families are interfaith, and are most welcome, TBE follows the Reform movement's resolution to educate children raised in homes where no other religious identity is taught.

PROCEDURES FOR PREPARING, SERVING AND CLEANING UP SUNDAY TBE RELIGIOUS SCHOOL SNACK

- **Snack is served on the patio at 11:00am - when children are finished with classes. Food should be out and ready to serve by 10:45.**
- **Plan for about 50 people - children, parents, teachers, staff, etc.**
- **On one of the tables, have something vegan (no animal products or dairy of any kind). This will be for those who are vegetarian or vegan. (3 or 4 servings)**

10:00 to 11:00

Prepare snack

- Identify serving dishes and serving pieces (set up for one table)
- Turn on ovens if you are going to bake or preheat meal

10:30

- 4 or 5 pitchers of punch/tang with tons of ice
- Two pitchers of water with ice
- Cups stacked open side down.

Whether preparing snack in TBE kitchen or bringing from home:

- Put food platters and serving pieces out with duplicate set ups on one/two rectangle tables in the patio
- If serving dishes are hot, put down pot holders or hand towels.
- On outside ends of each table, stack paper plates, paper napkins and a tub of the TBE stainless forks, knives, spoons located in drawers in kitchen by door to kitchen.
- Wheel out the cart upon which are the handled- green and blue tubs for the dirty flatware (marked). Leave it by the kitchen doors for bussing.

11:00am – 11:30am

AFTER THE HA-MOTZI, serve snack. Two people serving per table works best.

11:30 to 12:00 p.m.

Cleaning up patio and kitchen

REMIND CHILDREN AND ADULTS TO BUS THEIR TRASH AND FLATWARE.

- Put whatever trash is left on tables in garbage cans.
- Wheel in the cart with dirty flatware. Move the flatware containers to the counter by the round sink.
- Soak pots and trays in soap and water by kitchen sink.
- Soak all utensils in black water-filled container to left of round sink.
- Thoroughly wipe down counters.
- Empty trash into dumpsters and reline garbage cans. If someone is working as custodian, s/he will do this.
- Check to be sure ovens and stove burners are **OFF**.
- Please leave door to kitchen bolted open for Andrew to lock after Church leaves.

TEMPLE BETH EL KASHRUT POLICY

The TBE Kashrut (Kosher) policy is meant to allow as many congregants as possible to feel comfortable at Temple events. Those who do observe kashrut should feel welcome at our events, and be able to partake of the food. The policy is not meant to suggest or impose stricter observance on the part of our congregation.

The Temple Beth El Kashrut Policy applies to all events at the Temple or sponsored by the Temple. Private events held elsewhere by congregants (e.g., B'nai Mitzvah celebrations and other Jewish lifecycle events) are not covered by this policy; however it is hoped that no *treif* (e.g., shellfish/pork) will be served at these events.

Please note that pork and shellfish are not allowed on the Temple remises. Kosher fish have fins and scales. If you are uncertain of a product's status, please feel free to call the Temple. We do not require a *hechsher* (kosher seal of approval) for dairy or meat products.

The TBE policy is that at any meal or *oneg*, foods with dairy and meat must be on separate tables. If an individual chooses to combine milk and meat on their own plate, that is their choice. The sponsor of such an event, where food is being served, may find it useful to have a third table for *parve* (neither dairy nor meat) dishes. While *parve* dishes are appropriate on both a dairy and a meat table, the use of a *parve* table makes it clear that the dishes on that table can be eaten with either dairy or meat dishes.

Pesach

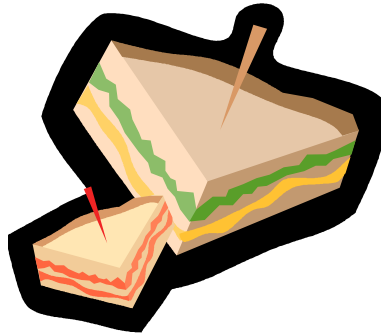
During *Pesach* (Passover), we are forbidden all leavened products except "Kosher for Passover" *matzah*, *matzah* meal, cookies, etc. The Temple follows the Ashkenazic tradition. Rice, corn, and legumes (such as beans, peas, lentils, peanut and soy products) are not permissible.

This Kashrut Policy was developed by the Religious Practices Committee guided by Rabbi Suzanne Singer and revised in 2012. (Kashrut Policy 9/11/08). The policy was revised again in 2015 to suggest the use of a third table for *parve* dishes.

TBE IMMUNIZATION POLICY
Temple Beth El Religious Education Committee
Effective September 4, 2015
Revised September 29, 2015
Revised September 26, 2017

The Temple Beth El Religious Education Committee affirms that, in the case of mandatory immunizations, the Jewish values of pikuach nefesh (saving a life) and refuah bedukah (proven remedies) are our guiding principles. Reform Jewish religious tenets prioritize protecting the health of all individuals, the most medically vulnerable members of the community, and the community as a whole. Therefore, we require immunizations of our students for the following: measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR), and tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (Tdap). In addition, we strongly encourage immunizations for these other contagious diseases: varicella (chicken pox) and hepatitis.

It should be noted that **individuals who have been vaccinated for the above diseases cannot transmit them to** unvaccinated persons.

Dear Parents,

Although we hope that we will never have to use these items, we do desire to be prepared for any eventuality. Therefore, we are asking you to please create an emergency kit for each child. This kit should contain:

- 1) A photo of your family & a "love" note from you to your child. This is valuable in helping children should there be a time span before you can come for them.
- 2) If your child takes any medication, we also request that you supply enough medication for 72 hours, along with written instructions regarding how and when to administer, as well as your permission for administration. Also include any medications needed for any possible allergic reaction. Please monitor expiration dates – it is best if the medication remains valid for the entire school year.
- 3) A packet of food/snacks
 1. 1 ready-to-eat single serving cereal
 2. 1-2 small cans of fruit juice
 3. 2-3 packets/bottles of water
 4. 1 fruit roll up
 5. 2 crackers w/cheese or PB
 6. 1-2 beef jerky
 7. 1 canned pudding
 8. 1 small cup applesauce or similar
 9. 1-2 granola bars
 10. 1 small can ravioli or spaghetti w/pull top
 11. Moist towelette

Please make sure to include expiration dates for all food.

Thank you for your kind assistance in helping us to help your child should the need arise. Please place all items in a heavy duty plastic bag that secures tightly – with your child's name boldly on the outside.

4. When the child returns from camp, s/he will share the camp experiences at a Family Shabbat service.

This application should be returned to the Temple office by January 31. Please be sure all appropriate documentation is attached (see above). Scholarships will be awarded for half of the camp fee, up to a maximum of \$500.00 **as long as there are funds available in the Campership fund.**
